FROM THE MINISTER

Dear Friends,

Had enough of the rain? Many have. Houses have been flooded, businesses interrupted even brought to the edge of closing, education brought to a grinding halt in some places as schools and colleges were affected. Summer, 'you must be joking' is the cry of many. But it is summer and in some peoples lives the summer has shone through.

Whilst many have suffered, others have seen rays of sunshine come into their lives. Trainees, trainers, funders, trustees of Roots and Shoots, a horticultural training establishment for disadvantaged young people, met HRH Prince Charles as he opened a new eco-building on site in Kennington. To see the joy in the eyes of the very young as they waited outside of the garden, the interest and enthusiasm of the Trainees, and the commitment and warmth of Prince Charles as he toured the wildlife garden and other areas prior to the opening of the building, was a wonder to behold. All enjoyed it and the pleasure it engendered. The Prince even stayed longer than expected!

Yet again others have felt the rain as water came into their eyes and hearts as they lost love ones. Whether it be in Afghanistan, Iraq or in their own home; by their own hand or the hands of others, by accident, illness or crime, the tears are the same, the hurt tearing people apart the same, the guilt, the blame, the shame, the same.

Synod heard of the national programme of events to mark **Set All Free** (on the 200th anniversary of the 1807 Act abolishing the Slave Trade) and indicated whole-hearted support for the **Strangers into Citizens** campaign for an earned amnesty for undocumented migrant workers. That campaign, organised by London Citizens, included a major event two weeks later when a number of Methodists attended a special Mass for migrant workers at Westminster Roman Catholic Cathedral then marched to Trafalgar Square to be addressed by Politicians, Trade Unionists and Religious Leaders, including the Rev Ermal Kirby.

There was also a presentation of the proposals coming to Conference for a revamped Connexional Team. 'Team Focus' will have major implications, not only for individual Team members, but also for the way in which the whole Church organises its work at a connexional level. There were also reports of national and European conferences that members had attended, while at a local level we heard testimonies of the church's response to community need in the wake of the mini tornado at Kensal Rise and the stabbing of a teenager in Leytonstone.

Altogether, there was much to ponder and to hold before God in thanksgiving and intercession...
