



#### Christopher Metcalfe 7<sup>th</sup> November 1935 – 24<sup>th</sup> July 2015

Dennis and I first met Chris and Deirdre Metcalfe in 1990, when we were members at Clock House Methodist Church. They had just arrived in Beckenham from the Malvern area and were looking for a church to join. Chris was travelling up to London each day from Clockhouse Station and had noticed the church by the station. They were Anglicans, but for some reason they decided to try our church first.

It could all have turned out quite differently because Clockhouse Methodist Church was undergoing extensive repairs and the services were being held in the Church Hall. The building was not originally a church. It was built on the side of a hill. The church is at street level whilst the church hall is directly beneath it. Chris and Deirdre had difficulty in finding the way in. Fortunately I saw them coming down the slope at the side of the church and then going back up. I rushed out and caught up with them before they gave up the attempt.

We were very fortunate in our new members. They both learnt to love the church and spent much time on the building and with the fellowship. Their faith and love for the Lord was clear to all who met them. In time Deirdre became a Steward and a Mother and Toddler Club Leader amongst other things. When we had a pantomime Deirdre was 'Buttons' whilst Chris made a wonderful Ugly Sister! Chris became Property Secretary and, after retirement, a Leader in the after-school Bible Club, and a member of the Church Council, amongst other things.

After a while it became apparent that Chris had a call to preach. He became a much loved Preacher who worked tirelessly for his Lord. We had many joyful times with both of them and a few others at the weekly Friday evening Prayer Meeting at Clockhouse. They were also two of the instigators of the Celebration services in the Bromley Circuit held on some Saturday evenings. Chris also led an Alpha Course. He also had a very active role as Secretary of the Churches Together in Beckenham Committee. Dennis played cricket with Chris at South Beckenham Cricket Club and enjoyed two cricket tours to Malvern organised by Chris.

When Chris and Deirdre came to Anerley Methodist Church they became very active in the church here. They were both appreciated in the Forest Hill Circuit. Chris was very much a 'circuit person'; his involvement in the

Brigade at Wesley Hall is remembered with affection. He was a preachermentor. Chris and Deirdre had a great gift for friendship. They were always ready to be supportive. They are remembered by many people for their love, concern and practical help.

We remember when they were considering whether they should move back to the Malvern area in order to be nearer to their family. It was a wrench to leave friends – but after much prayer they decided to move to Upton upon Severn. They obviously chose to do what God wanted because Chris had a wonderful, if too short, a ministry in that place. The Baptist Church was without a Minister at that time and Chris' preaching skills were much appreciated. Their home was also the venue for many bible studies, prayers and discussions.

Others may tell you of Chris' career and his family – but I tell you of his love for the Lord Jesus Christ and his faithfulness in sharing the Gospel.

A service of thanksgiving for the life of Christopher Metcalfe was held at Upton Baptist Church on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> August 2015. The church was full and included two of his godchildren and members of the Blackheath and Crystal Palace and Bromley Circuits. In tribute to the man who was a faithful servant to his Lord, the gospel was faithfully and powerfully preached and God's praises were joyfully sung.

It is a privilege to have known him and to have called him a friend.

#### **COOKERY CORNER**

#### **Date and Walnut Loaf**

#### **Ingredients**

200gr.(8 oz) stoned dates, chopped; 1 egg, beaten

1 teaspn. Bicarbonate of soda; 50gr.(2oz) chopped walnuts

100gr.(4 oz) butter, cut into pieces

100gr (4 oz) dark muscavado sugar

280 gr. (10oz) self raising flour, sifted

2 tablespoons Demerara sugar

#### Method

- 1. Mix the dates & bicarbonate of soda in a large bowl with a pinch of salt.
- 2. Pour on 300ml ( $\frac{1}{2}$  pint) hot water, stir well and leave until cold.
- 3. Pre-heat the oven to 180°C/fan oven 160°/Gas mark 4.
- 4. Butter a 1 kg (2lb) loaf tin
- 5. Rub the butter pieces into the flour until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs.
- 6. Stir in the walnuts and muscovado sugar until evenly combined.
- 7. Tip the flour mixture and egg into the cooled dates.
- 8. Beat well to mix, then pour into the prepared tin and

- sprinkle the Demerara sugar on top.
- 9. Bake in the oven for 1-1½ hours or until a skewer comes out clean.
- 10. Cool in the tin for 15 minutes, then turn out on to a wire tray.
- 11. Double-wrap the cooled cake and store in an air-tight tin for 1-2 days before eating.


