LETTER FROM THE MINISTER

The Yes and No campaign has concluded with a "NO". All of us waited impatiently for the results. Perhaps like me the first thing you did in the morning was to check the results. I must say that I am pleased with the outcome because from my forefather's experience, the separation of India and Pakistan not only laid down boundaries between Pakistan and India but also divided families and friends. After the partition my grandparents never saw many of their relatives on other side of the border because of the ongoing conflicts between these two countries.

I understand that it is a completely different scenario, but then there are those who are bitterly disappointed with the outcome. However, the Scottish referendum has achieved much more than just deciding their future. People were given the freedom to choose between "Yes" and "No". As it is always, there were those who instigated and guided the choices of undecided voters. There were heated debates to win voters to their side of the argument. On both sides people were passionately involved in the discussion about the future of Scotland. From media reports it seemed obvious that communities were thinking seriously about the choice that they had to make. They had to engage with the process and live with the consequences. Many think that the way people have engaged with the process has breathed new spirit into the politics of Great Britain.

Similarly in our day to day life, especially as Christians, free-

dom is not simply about choosing between "Yes" or "No". The choices we make are more complicated than just making a choice between Yes or No with possible outcomes. Our small choices influence and shape our whole life. May be this is why our freedom to choose Christ's way leaves us with some restrictions. Being disciples we do not use the freedom of choice to say yes to sin. There are borders around our thoughts and actions that shape our life's movement in this world.

However, the Christian understanding of freedom goes much deeper than that. It is an act of being. It is about movement that takes to a certain direction where one's self is given toward the other. Maybe freedom is a relationship of love. You are free to enjoy the relationship with the one you love and respect the freedom given in the boundaries of that relationship. For instance our relationship with the church community gives us freedom to express God's love in worship and fellowship but like any other relationship we respect and honour the boundaries our relationship imposes. We cannot do whatever we like because we have freedom. Yes we are free to choose in relation to each other when standing at the crossroads to say "Yes" or "No".

Our freedom in God is the movement of life in which our whole life respond to God's self-giving love in Christ and entering into the life of freedom of self-giving obedience, freedom of love and joyful service to God and to one another. My hope and prayer is that we may continue to cherish the selfgiving freedom we are given by God in Christ. Amen

OXFAM

Many thanks to those of you who subscribe on a regular basis to OXFAM. I'll run the year out before I announce how much we've raised during 2014. I am very pleased with the amount so far but, of course, I can always do with some more regular subscribers. Please let me know if you can spare 50p. per month!

The October OXFAM Newsletter highlights the conflict in Syria and says they are doing all they can to help those affected by the crisis. They have been meeting with Syrian refugees in Jordan to find out how best to help people whose lives have been turned upside down.

Families have often left comfortable homes, decent jobs and even loved ones behind. More than 65% of refugees surveyed fear they may never get back to Syria. Za'atari refugee camp is now home to between 80,000 and 120,000 residents. A large percentage of the refugees said that the biggest problem is accessing things like medicine, education, legal services and even food. 25% of them said that not knowing about services on offer stopped them getting help. Most rely on word of mouth for information, which distorts the facts.

OXFAM are now distributing leaflets about services available an holding awareness sessions on people's legal rights. This is made possible through the relatively small support people like ourselves at Anerley are able to give. Kedgeree

Inaredients

500gr (1lb) smoked haddock	125gr (4oz)
200ml (1⁄3 pint) skimmed milk	salt and pep
150gr (5oz) long-grained rice	parsley sprig
1 hard-boiled egg, chopped	

peas, cooked pper

- Poach the haddock in the milk for 10 minutes or until 1 tender.
- Drain, reserving the liquor, flake the fish and remove 2. any skin

- Stir in the fish, egg, peas and a little of the fish liquor. 5.
- Season with salt and pepper, then place over a low heat 6. until heated through.
- Transfer to a warmed serving dish and garnish with 7. parsley.



If you are given lilies, cut the pollen bearing stamens from the lilies before arranging them and make sure you wash any pollen from your hands and brush any pollen from your cat.
