#### USED POSTAGE STAMPS

Valerie is still collecting your used stamps for the Leprosy Mission, and is grateful to receive any you may have. Commemorative, foreign and definitive (ordinary ones) are all acceptable.

If you are able to trim them yourself please leave a 5mm (1/4 inch) single thickness border around the edge. If you are unable to trim them round yourself, please tear round the stamp leaving a large enough margin to be trimmed.

We give the stamps to the Leprosy Mission who, whenever possible, sell direct to collectors, but failing this the stamps are sold at auction or to the trade. The Leprosy Mission also hold their own stamp fairs at Clanfield, Peterborough, Maldon (Essex) and Maidstone in Kent.

It is appreciated that many large businesses and official departments now use other delivery firms to handle their post instead of the Post Office, and so fewer letters and parcels will have stamps on them. However, with Christmas approaching, you are bound to have some cards through the post, so don't throw the envelopes away before you have cut off the stamps!

#### OXFAM

Joan Loring, our current Pledged Giving collector, has received the following letter from Oxfam:

"Thanks very much for your Pledged Giving donation of  $\pounds 145...$ Oxfam has been responding to emergencies for over 70 years, in 2011 we were present at 55 emergencies around the world. Currently millions of people in Yemen are facing widespread hunger and chronic malnutrition. The shortage of food means that many people cannot afford to feed their families and have now exhausted every option, bringing them close to breaking point.

In the north and south of the country over 400,000 people remain displaced. Among them is Rafiqa, who found refuge in the camps and remembers the struggles. *"Women in particular suffered, as there was no privacy, and this issue was considered minor compared to our tough sanitation. There was only one tap, where we raced to get water for drinking and washing."* 

The cause of this is the severe humanitarian crisis generated by the conflict between the government forces and tribal groups. The parties involved are divided over their approaches to help the poorest regions in the country, which is delaying responses and holding back funding. However, the crisis has built up so much that doing nothing is no longer an option. Plans that address both urgent humanitarian needs and longer-term structural concerns must be put into action.

Oxfam has been helping within al these crises including assisting nearly 60,000 people living in makeshift camps and informal settlements through the provision of safe water, sanitation and hygiene services. We are also helping hundreds of families to rebuild their livelihoods by providing people with goats and fodder, as well as equipping communities with basic entrepreneurial skills so that they can begin new lives.

#### COOKERY CORNER

#### West Country Pudding

Serves 5-6; Oven temperature 375°F/190°C/ Mark 5 Cooking time- 1 hour

#### **Ingredients**

175g (6oz) self raising flour 75g (3oz) suet water to mix 675g (1½ lb) cooking apples, peeled, cored and sliced 50g (2oz) sugar

Topping\_13g (1/2 oz) margarine; 75g (3oz) soft brown sugar

#### **Method**

1. Mix together dry pastry ingredients with sufficient water to make a firm but pliable dough.

2. Cream together toppinging redients and spread on the bottom of a well-greased  $1\frac{1}{2}$  pint pie dish.

3. Roll out  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the pastry and use to line the dish.

4. Fill the dish with sliced apples, sprinkle with sugar, finishing with a layer of apples.

5. Roll out the remaining pastry to cover apples and seal edges firmly.

6.Place on a baking tray and bake in the centre of the oven for about an hour, until golden.

7. Turn out the pudding onto a large dish, the sauce will run out and cover the dish

8. Serve hot with custard or cream

#### METHODIST WOMEN IN BRITAIN (MWiB)

The District Day of the London District was held on Saturday 3rd November at Walworth Methodist Church with the theme of Discipleship—what does it mean to be a Methodist woman in 21st century Britain and what is our calling?
