

LETTER FROM OXFAM

Joan Loring, our Pledged Giving collector, has received the following letter from Oxfam:

“Thank you very much for your Pledged Giving donation to Oxfam of £92...

International Women’s Day is 8th march and we know that there are still huge steps to be made around the world before equality is achieved.

In many countries women are still:

- Missing out on an education. Two-thirds of all children denied school are girls.
- Suffering horrendous domestic violence - the single biggest cause of death and injury to women worldwide.
- Dying needlessly in childbirth. Every minute a woman with no medical care dies in pregnancy and childbirth.

There are around 1.3 billion people living in extreme poverty worldwide; more than two-thirds of them are women and girls. Statistics like these reflect the bleak reality of life for millions of women in the developing world. Entrenched attitudes deny them their rights, effectively keeping them poorer than men. As a result, whole communities fall further into poverty.

All of Oxfam’s projects have equality at their heart, ensuring women overcome the discrimination they face, and secure their basic rights. Just three examples are

- Supporting girls’ education in Mali
- Supporting women in business in Vietnam
- Supporting maternity care in Ghana

PERCEPTION

In Washington DC, USA, at a Metro Station on a cold January morning in 2007 a man with a violin played six Bach pieces for about an hour. During that time, approximately 2,000 people went through the station, most of them on their way to work.

After about 3 minutes, a middle-aged man noticed that there was a musician playing. He slowed his pace and stopped for a few seconds, and then he hurried on to meet his schedule. About 4 minutes later, the violinist received his first dollar. A woman threw money into the hat and, without stopping, continued to walk. At 6 minutes, a young man leaned against the wall to listen to him, then looked at his watch and started to walk again.

At 10 minutes, a 3 year old boy stopped, but his mother tugged him along hurriedly. This action was repeated by several other children, but every parent - without exception - forced their children to move on quickly. At 45 minutes, the musician played continuously. Only 6 people stopped and listened for a short while. About 20 gave money but continued to walk at their normal pace. The man collected a total of \$32. After 1 hour he finished playing and silence took over. No one noticed and no one applauded. There was no recognition at all.

No one knew this, but the violinist was Joshua Bell, one of the greatest musicians in the world. He played one of the most intricate pieces ever written, with a violin worth \$3.5 million. Two days before, Joshua Bell sold-out a theatre in Boston where the seats averaged \$100 to sit and listen to him play the same music. Joshua Bell, playing incognito at the station, was organised by the Washington Post as part of a social experiment about perception, taste and people's priorities.

If we do not have a moment to stop and listen to one of the best musicians in the world, playing some of the finest music ever written, with one of the most beautiful instruments ever made... how many other things are we missing as we rush through life?

Enjoy life NOW - it has an expiration date.

COOKERY CORNER

Somerset Apple Cake

Ingredients

225gr (8oz) self-raising flour

½ teaspn mixed spice

75gr.(3 oz) margarine

75gr (3 oz) caster sugar

1 lb (450gr) cooking apples, peeled, cored & finely chopped

1 egg, beaten

A little milk

Method

1. Rub the margarine into the flour and spice mixture until it resembles fine breadcrumbs.
2. Stir in the sugar, apples and egg and enough milk to give a fine dropping consistency.
3. Spoon the mixture into a greased & lined 20cm (8 inch) cake tin and bake in a moderate oven (375°F, 190°C, Gas Mark 5) for 1 - 1½ hours.
4. Turn on to a wire rack and leave to cool.
5. Serve sprinkled with caster sugar.
