

Dear Friends,

Have you seen a daffodil lately? One that is out I mean!

Daffodils, the heralds of Spring, the flowers that normally brighten up Mothering Sunday, all gone missing! I walked through the park this morning and 'hosts of golden daffodils', are poking their stunted heads to the heavens, waking but not yet woken. The colour, the vibrancy, the trumpeting of Spring is not there.

OXFAM

Joan Loring, our Pledged Giving collector, has received the following letter from Oxfam:

"Thank you very much for your Pledged Giving donation to Oxfam of £73. .. Responding to the Haiti earthquake has been one of the toughest challenges in the history of Oxfam Although aid is beginning to get through, the impact of the earthquake on Oxfam's Haitian and international staff, the logistical challenges combined with a destroyed office and warehouse and the loss of communications have made this the one of the hardest responses we have ever mounted.

"Oxfam lost two employees among the currently estimated 80,000 fatalities and most of our staff had their homes damaged or destroyed and are sleeping outside like the rest of the Haitian population.

"The staff salvaged some stocks from the destroyed warehouse, and new equipment for providing clean water and sanitation is now arriving. Oxfam is using Santo Domingo in the Dominican Republic as a hub for supplies from the UK, which will go by road to Port-au-Prince. Ten tonnes of new stock has been flown from the United Kingdom to Santo Domingo and has now arrived at Port-au Prince. A further thirty tonnes of stock will depart from the UK immediately and will be followed by a further flight, carrying 50 more tonnes of Oxfam aid after that.

At the end they will receive a Certificate in Basic Computer Skills, which is a nationally accredited course.
