Charity Bake-Off

Imagine, if you can, that you are driving home from work one day and suddenly find that your vision is failing! Unsurprisingly you are frightened and go immediately to your doctor who sends you off - urgently to hospital. At hospital the medical staff can do little to reassure you but although you may need some surgical intervention you are sent home as they cannot provide ophthalmic care at the weekend. Back home you are faced with the prospect of sudden blindness and your concern heightens as your evesight progressively fails. Eventually you do have surgery to correct a detached retina caused by a bleed and scar to the macula. The macular is a part of the retina at the back of the eye. It's only as big as a grain of rice but gives us our central vision, much of our colour vision and the fine detail of what we see. This is not just a worrying story – it actually happened to Comfort Oppong and there is a history of age related macular degeneration in her family. In most cases treatment, though unpleasant can correct the problem, but more research and greater availability of trained ophthalmic professionals is needed to prevent the loss of sight and ensure that sufferers get speedy reassurance and help.

It was the experience of Comfort and the family history of macular degeneration that led Hilary to arrange a Charity Bake-Off at Anerley on 1st June. This was a real family effort with the Oppong family and friends organising a baking competition and arranging for cakes to be baked for sale at the event. The well organised and fun filled afternoon was well attended by friends, family and church members and we were treated not only to great food and music but also to a table quiz based on food and drink. Well done to Hilary and the family who at the time of writing have raised a magnificent £429.28. Young people were encouraged to "adopt" a grandparent for a lifetime not just for a day or a year. This is usually celebrated on the first Sunday after Labour day in September

The Charity Age Concern initially introduced this celebration to the UK in 1990. It is normally celebrated on the first Sunday in October since 2008- (though it is not widely known about) This year's UK Grandparent's Day falls on 6 October 2013.

Our Grandparents are very special people they are the ones who make us what we are today.

COOKERY CORNER

Vanilla Custard Flan

Serves 5-6 Oven temperature 400°F/200°C/Gas mark 6

Ingredients

For the pastry case

25gr.(1oz) Trex 25gr.(1oz) margarine 100gr.(4oz) plain flour water to mix

For the filling

2 large eggs (separated)25gr (1oz) plain flour75gr (3oz) sugar450mg(¾ pint) milk25gr (1oz) cornflour¾ teaspoon vanilla essence3 level tablespoons desiccated coconut, browned under grill

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven
- 2. Make the pastry: rub the fat into the flour until mixture resembles breadcrumbs.
- 3. Stir in enough water to give a soft, not sticky, dough.
- 4. Knead lightly and (if time) wrap in cling film and chill in the fridge for ½ hour.
- 5. On a lightly floured surface roll the pastry out and line a flan case, prick the base, then line with greaseproof paper and weigh down the base with dry beans.
- 6. Bake in the centre of the oven for 20 minutes, remove the paper and beans and return to the oven for 5 to 10

minutes

- 7. Cream the egg yolks with the sugar, cornflour and flour and a little milk until mixture is smooth.
- 8. Heat the rest of the milk to just below simmering, then pour it over the egg mixture, stirring all the time.
- 9. Return the custard to the pan, bring to the boil, stirring continuously, boil gently for 1 to 2 minutes, remove from heat and stir in vanilla essence.
- 10. Whisk egg whites until stiff, then stir into warm custard.
- 11. When both flan case and filling are cold, spoon filling into pastry case and level the top.
- 12. Sprinkle toasted coconut over the top of the flan.
