MINISTER'S LETTER

I am very pleased to say that this summer we had another Bible Study course completed, mainly led by John Taylor and Valerie Tredinnick. They both brought depth of knowledge, years of experience and spiritual care and honesty to these sessions. During our studies we had in-depth discussion on some of the popular themes covered in Paul's writings. In a friendly and open environment we wrestled with some complicated topics covered in Paul's writings in the New Testament. Two of the topics that I enjoyed and found challenging were on love (agape) and Christian living in a materialistic world. We had engaging discussion about the challenges of loving some who is difficult to love and inconsiderate most of the time. Similarly how can we remain free from attachment to our material possessions? Loving unconditionally and remaining unattached to our material possession is a challenge we all face.

We are familiar with the phrase which says *practice makes perfect*. Maybe we can apply it to *Love* as well. The more you practice it the more it will become a part of you. There are things we have to learn before we can do them and we grow by doing them. I think agape love is one of those things and like faith you grow in it with practice. The more you practice it the more you will have. Even if you don't like the idea just give it a go and see if it works! Just remember that growing is a slow process and often we need someone else to tell us about our growth, so don't jump to conclusions on your own.

Our love for our possessions; it is our prayer that everyone should have enough to live a comfortable and meaningful life in a developed country like ours. We want poverty to be a thing of past. Maybe in Paul's time it was easy to live without lots of possessions but with astonishing advancements it may be difficult for many to live without expensive equipment of communication and white goods that have become essential part of many lives? Perhaps with the demands that modern life puts on us, most of our possessions are essentials. May be being not materialistic means not so much about how much or what we possess but it how we see what is in our possession? Many compassionate Christians share their possessions with those in need. God created and gave many things into our possession to have a meaningful life but Christians are also encouraged to share their possessions with those in need and use them for God's mission. I think trouble arises when we become precious about our possessions and pursue to have more and Christian ethics becomes secondary

Let the joy of our Christ be our sole possession and his unconditional love enable us to love those who are difficult to love.

REV. STEVE WILD

President of the Methodist Conference 2015-2016.

In his inaugural address at the Conference in Southport, the Revd. Steve Wild challenged each Methodist church in Britain to aim to bring just one person to faith in the coming year, saying, "Let's take God seriously. I want to help us in the task of evangelism, to put mission on the agenda and give our churches an aim to win a person for Christ."

"We cannot sit back in complacency," he added. "We have a massive Kingdom of God task. I'm wanting this year to challenge each church to bring one person to faith—to make one new member this next year, let's make bringing people to faith the main point, we don't do it alone. The unconditional love of Jesus is our motivation."

He told those gathered at the Conference that John Wesley only had ten guineas to his name when he died. Wesley's will directed that four of these guineas should pay four unemployed men to carry his coffin and the remainder be distributed among his poorest preachers.

"What else did he leave behind?" Steve asked. "Changed lives, hundreds of them, Christian communities dotted all over this country and in other parts of the world, fellowships seeking to take God seriously. Oh that we may all draw to the foot of the cross and experience this powerful love and make this our legacy, one of transformed lives and communities!"

This year for the first time the Penge Festival held a poetry competition open to anyone living in the London Borough of Bromley. The entries were judged by the manager of Beckenham Library and two former heads of English, one of whom is a published author, and the awards were made at this year's Walter de la Mare Poetry Evening on 19th June.



COOKERY CORNER

Strawberry Flan

Ingredients

For the sweet pastry

175gr (6oz) plain flour 50gr (2oz) Trex or similar I med egg yolk, beaten

50gr (2oz) butter 2 teaspoons Caster sugar

For the Filling

I med egg, plus I extra egg yolk 50gr (20z) Caster sugar 25gr (1oz) plain flour 300ml (½ pint) milk few drops of vanilla essence 450gr (1lb) strawberries, cleaned and hulled mint leaves to decorate

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 200°C/400°F/ Gas mark 6
- 2. Place the flour, butter and Trex in a bowl and mix until it resembles fine breadcrumbs.
- 3. Stir in the sugar, egg yolk and water to make a fairly stiff dough.
- 4. Knead lightly, cover and chill in a refrigerator for 30 mins
- 5. Roll out the pastry and use to line a 23cm (9 inch) loose -bottomed flan tin.
- 6. Bake in the oven for 15-20 minutes with greaseproof paper and beans or rice.

- 7. Leave to cool.
- 8. Make the filling by whisking the eggs and sugar until thick and pale.
- 9. Gradually stir in the flour, then the milk.
- 10. Pour into a small saucepan and simmer for 3-4 minutes, stirring throughout.
- 10. Add the vanilla essence, pour into a bowl and leave to cool.
- 11. Cover with greaseproof paper to prevent a skin from forming
- 12. When the filling is cold, whisk until smooth then pour into the cooked flan case
- 13. Slice the strawberries and arrange on top of the filling
- 14. Decorate with mint leaves and serve.

NB As this serves 4, it can be halved or even quartered as I have done as a treat for myself!

OUTREACH TO THE HOMELESS—A LOCAL FOCUS

For over 25 years we have distributed food, clothing and toiletries to London's homeless.

On a much smaller scale, but on a more regular basis, we have also supported the local homeless and vulnerable, and we have been aware that the support we offer locally ought to increase because the need in our area has changed significantly, as we can see from the food banks operating from most of our churches.

Our committee is already involved with various other voluntary groups and many of us volunteer and support the excellent work that Living Well (based at Holy Trinity, Lennard Road) provides to local vulnerable people, many of whom are homeless or in temporary accommodation or hostels.

Since Saturday 14th March 2015 Outreach to the Homeless has been operating a weekly clothes bank alongside Living Well's food bank. We believed this was the right time to make this move from London as there are a number of new initiatives supporting London's homeless. The goods donated to us come from local people and churches, and we will now be supporting some of the most vulnerable people around us. We are particularly short of jeans, shoes, trainers and school uniforms.
