

#### FROM THE MINISTER

Not long ago we went through the advent season of watching and waiting. Now we are about to enter into a time of observing Lent. Lent is a period of 40 days not including Sundays. Generally those who observe Lent seek to give up (temporarily or permanently), or take on, something different. Giving up for Lent could involve stopping eating meat, giving up chocolate or stopping smoking. Taking on could involve building new habits such as exercising daily, ensuring that you only buy fair trade food, making an effort to contact distant friends, or start reading the Bible and praying daily. But most importantly Lent offers us all a very special opportunity to grow in our relationship with God and deepen our commitment to a way of life that glorifies Him. In all our business, Lent provides us with an opportunity to reflect upon our spiritual life, to pray persistently, to repent for failing God in our lives, to ask God for renewal and to be generous in receiving and giving.

Above all this, in this season God is inviting us once again to come back to Him with all our hearts. This is an amazing invitation for all of us. As community and individuals we can drop our defences that separate us from God. He is calling us to enjoy His everlasting love for everyone. But this enjoyment comes after a period of discipline and discipleship. Let us enter this Lent, a time of discipline, to receive an even cleaner heart from Him to enjoy God's Holy Love, Joy and Peace for ever.

### **RETIRING COLLECTIONS DURING FEBRUARY**

Our retiring collections at Communion Services during February will be for Macmillan Nurses, a national charity which supports many people affected by cancer, For these people Macmillan nurses are a valued and trusted source of expert information, advice and support - free of charge. As of December 2011, there were 3,707 Macmillan nurse posts across the UK, both in hospitals and in the community. All Macmillan nurses are registered nurses with at least five years' experience, including two or more years in cancer or palliative care. They complete specialist courses in managing pain and other symptoms, and in psychological support.

# CHRISTIAN AID NEWS

I t has been announced that Dr. Rowan Williams is to become the new chair of the Board of Trustees of Christian Aid, after stepping down from the post of Archbishop of Canterbury at the end of December. He succeeds Dame Anne Owers, who completed her term of office as chair of Christian Aid in November. Dr. Williams will take up his post in May 2013.

Announcing his appointment in December, Christian Aid Director Ms. Loretta Minghella said," Archbishop Rowan brings a passionate interest in tackling the symptoms and causes of poverty, a profound theological understanding, and deep experience of addressing issues of environmental, economic and social justice with church and political leaders across the world. This is wonderful news for Christian Aid."

Commenting on his appointment, Dr. Williams said," I am very honoured indeed to be invited to chair the Board of Christian Aid. I had hoped very much to be able to continue some regular involvement in support and advocacy in the area of international justice and development, and this will allow such involvement to flourish.

"Many years of co-operation with and support for Christian Aid have made me familiar with the excellent quality of all that they do, and I am personally very happy indeed to be working with them in this new role at a time when international development issues will need the most dedicated and sustained attention." ## **COOKERY CORNER**

#### **Queen of Puddings**

Total cooking time 1hr 10 minutes

Oven temp. 350°F/Mark 4/ 180°C reducing to 300°F/Mark 2/150°C

#### **Ingredients**

36gr (1½oz) fresh bread crumbs2eggs6gr.(¼ oz) sugar1 table1 dessertspn sugar75gr (3grated rind of ½ lemonglace1 small can evaporated milk

1 tablespoon jam 75gr (3oz) sugar for meringue glace cherries & angelica

#### <u>Method</u>

- 1. Put breadcrumbs, butter, sugar and lemon rind in a basin.
- 2. Make evaporated milk up to <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> pint with water
- 3. Warm milk, pour onto crumbs & allow to stand for 10 minutes
- 4. Separate eggs and beat yolks into milk mixture
- 5. Turn into a buttered pint-sized pie dish and bake in a moderate oven for 30 minutes until set.
- 6. Spread with jam
- 7. For meringue: whip egg whites stiffly
- 8. Whip in 1 tablespoon of sugar, fold in remainder
- Pile meringue on top of pudding and bake in a cool oven for 40 mins. or until meringue is firm and lightly browned.
- 10. Decorate with cherries and angelica


