

MINISTER'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

I hope this Easter season was able to offer you time, space and opportunity to reflect on Christ's death, resurrection and ascension. I found this Easter season a unique experience because it was my first Easter as minister. This was an opportunity for me to rise to a different level of spiritual growth. During my preparation for talks and reflection I experienced profound and deep realities about God's way of doing of things. I found myself surrounded by many questions and challenges that the Easter season imposes on spiritual learners.

There were some revelation moments as well and many times I said to myself that 'this is a new understanding for me". I can say that I know a bit more about the mystery of Christ's death, resurrection and ascension than last year. These mysteries are among the most important aspects of Christian faith.

Reflecting on these characteristics of Christian faith through prayer and studying the scripture can help us all to understand God's mind. All God has done and still is doing makes more sense when we put some effort, time and energy to reflect on and appreciate God's work. We become more aware of God's plan for his people that through the death of Christ He reconciled us all back to himself and makes us righteous through the death of His precious Son, Jesus Christ.

Jesus' resurrection helps us to reflect on hope. When Christ died on the cross, all appeared lost, but in reality that was the beginning of our hope. It was the pivotal, most important and crucial event in the history of mankind and in the fulfilment of God's purpose. Upon this hinges the aspects of salvation and our hopes for everlasting life. We know it because Jesus rose from the dead and ascended to heaven and will come again to reward all the faithful with eternal life and happiness.

However, it is hard to deny the fact that sometimes, even for spiritually mature disciples, these elements of the Easter season do not make much sense. The way God seeks to establish his Kingdom is beyond human wisdom and understanding. It is because the realities in God's Kingdom are different from our aspirations, perceptions and viewpoints. Jesus knew that that we will struggle to understand this and before His death he promised to send the helper (Holy Spirit) who will help us to understand God's mind and reveal to us his plans. Before the coming of the Helper the disciples did not understand the meaning and the implication of what took place at the cross and during the following event. On Pentecost, when they were filled with Holy Spirit, they understood all that had happened and found the courage to share with others. They preached that the cross was God's intention. Now through his cross all the people can come to God and live in peace with each other.

My prayer for the church is that we may continue to open ourselves to the Holy Spirit for comfort, guidance and strength. Once we are filled with God's Spirit we will find it easier to share Him others. Romans 5:5 says that "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us". Being filled with Holy Spirit, let us continue to share God's love with earth other and the people we meet at bus stops, shops and work places.

COOKERY CORNER

West Country Pudding

Serves 4-6; Oven temperature 375°F/190°C/ Mark 5

Ingredients

175g (6oz) self raising flour

75g (3oz) suetwater to mix675g (1½ lb) cooking apples, peeled, cored and sliced50g (2oz) sugar

Topping 38g (1½ oz) margarine; 75g (3oz) soft brown sugar

<u>Method</u>

1. Mix together dry pastry ingredients with sufficient water to make a firm but pliable dough.

2. Cream together toppinging redients and spread on the bottom of a well-greased $1\frac{1}{2}$ pint pie dish.

3. Roll out 3/3 of the pastry and use to line the dish.

4. Fill the dish with sliced apples, sprinkle with sugar, finishing with a layer of apples.

5. Roll out the remaining pastry to cover apples and seal edges firmly.

6.Bake in the centre of the oven, on a baking tray, for about an hour or until golden.

7. Turn out the pudding onto a large dish, the sauce will run out and cover the pudding.

8. Serve hot with custard or cream
