MINISTER'S LETTER

We view life in many ways. Some see it as a journey, a story, a song, a roller-coaster ride, a mystery, beautiful or simply difficult. I think it really depends on one's experience or stage of life. It is only when our journey, story or song takes unthinkable, unimaginable or unexpected twists we feel surrounded by uncertainties and questions. I think only then we sincerely want to know and understand why things happen the way they happen. It is only then we ask some difficult questions.

Why should I ask myself difficult questions when my journey is without bumps, when my story appears to have a clear beginning, middle and end? I have not heard someone asking themselves; 'what is the purpose of my life' when they are happy and having the best time of their life such as one's wedding day or when your favourite football team is doing really well in the league.

At some point our lives get touched by something that challenges and shakes us to the core. Then we find ourselves seeking answers. Then we want to know the purposefulness and meanings of everything that happens to us. We want to know what is beyond us, if there is something. We want to know the truth.

But, can I figure it out myself or do I need help?

Our Gospel story is filled with many twists and turns accompanied by uncertainties and questions. On two certain occasions like these Jesus said to his disciples "You do not know what I am doing now but later you will understand" (John 13:7) and "I have many things to say that we cannot bear them now" (John 16:12). These words of Jesus don't seem to be very assuring in confusing circumstances but they do tell us to wait upon the Lord for understanding or wait for what God has in store for us. Like his disciples, in the midst of uncertainty and questions Je-

sus asks us to wait upon the Spirit of truth and when the Spirit of truth of comes, she will guide you into all truth. But sometimes we find the Spirit less visible and most silent of the persons of Godhead. Its work is mysterious and sometimes invisible to our perceptions.

Perhaps there are things that will only become clearer to us when we could bear them, but what do we do in the meantime?

I think we should hang on God's promises. Before his departure Jesus said to his disciples that he will never leave them helpless (John 14:19). He promised to send us a helper, the Holy Spirit. This promise was fulfilled on the day of Pentecost.

This also means that the things that leave us searching for meanings and purposefulness will become clearer and the truth will be revealed in God's time. In the meantime we could learn to be comfortable with the questions that we have. As life should sometimes leave us pondering, it should keep us searching. Maybe sometimes it is the will of the Spirit for us to live with not-knowing than to try to come up with our own answers which might be wrong. Don't be frightened by uncertainty, because sometimes we don't have to know the answers until it is revealed to us.

Our seasons of uncertainty are the most powerful God-moment because it is in these times we allow ourselves to experience the power of God leading us to ultimate triumph. It is in these seasons we are more likely to experience what it means to have a God who acts for those who wait for him. Especially thinking of all those at this time who have been on our prayer lists and are waiting upon God faithfully. May God remain your answer to all of your uncertainties.

OXFAM

Did you know that it is just over a year since Nepal had their devastating earthquake when many people lost their lives and others their homes and all their belongings?

OXFAM'S recent newsletter tells us what they have been doing to help over the past twelve month.

Providing Shelter: Oxfam gave 800 vulnerable families a winter kit containing mattresses, quilts, a tarpaulin, cooking vessels and blankets.

Schooling: A temporary school has been built and fresh water and sanitation has been provided, with separate toilets and wash areas for the girls.

Rebuilding Communities: Oxfam is helping people to rebuild their communities by introducing cash-for-work schemes and assisting households in restoring water supplies which will benefit the community as a whole.

These are just three examples in Nepal where OXFAM has been able to help thanks to your continuing contributions.

COOKERY CORNER

Apple Bread Pudding

(serves 4- 6)

Ingredients

1 tablespoon milk
2 large eggs
1/2 level teasp'n ground cinnamon
100gr (4 oz) fresh breadcrumbs
25gr(1 oz) sugar
450gr (1 lb) cooking apples, peeled and grated
25gr (1 oz) margarine or butter
15ml (I tablespoon) oil

18cm (7 in) frying pan with lid.

Method

- 1. Lightly beat together milk and eggs in a bowl.
- 2. Add the breadcrumbs, apples, sultanas, cinnamon and sugar.
- 3. Mix together well to form a dough
- 4. Heat margarine or butter and oil in the frying pan
- 5. Turn the apple mixture into the pan and press down evenly.
- 6. Place a lid or large plate over the top of the pan and fry gently for 10—15 minutes, checking that the underside does not over- brown.
- 7. When the first side is cooked, turn out onto an oiled plate then slide it back into the pan, uncooked side down.
- 8. Cook gently for a further 10—15 minutes
- 9. When cooked, sprinkle the Apple Bread Pudding with caster sugar and cut into wedges.

This pudding is delicious served hot or cold


As part of its charitable giving our Church donated £100 to the Welfare Fund at the Penge Churches Housing Association, and we have received the following reply:
