The closure of Latchmere House Resettlement Prison and its consequential impact on prisoners, staff and their families.

Loss of home, loss of life, loss of security.

It perhaps can prompt us how life that can seem so good, so enjoyable can in a stroke be taken away by things beyond our control.

And then in the midst of my anger, my despair, my disbelief, I heard a voice reminding me of Romans chapter 8 verse 28:

To many families, an unmarried Mother brings shame to the whole family, and abortion is their preference. As you can imagine a vast amount of clothing is needed, and although the baby things can be recycled, the toddler clothes are usually too worn out to use again.

COOKERY CORNER

LIME AND ORANGE MOUSSE

Ingredients

I packet lime jelly
¼ pint boiling water
325 g (11oz) can of mandarin oranges
175g (6oz) small can evaporated milk, chilled
1pint soufflé dish

Method

- 1. Chill the evaporated milk in the fridge for an hour or more.
- 2. Secure a paper collar of double thickness greaseproof paper around the soufflé dish to stand 2 ins above the top.
- 3. Break up the jelly and put into a bowl.
- 4. Pour on the boiling water and stir to dissolve.
- 5. Drain the juice from the mandarin oranges and chop half of the fruit.
- Add the chopped fruit and juice to the jelly.
- 7. Leave in a cold place until just on the point of setting.
- 8. Whisk the evaporated milk until thick, then whisk it into the jelly.
- 9. When evenly blended, pour into the soufflé dish.
- 10. Put in the fridge to set.
- 11. Decorate with the rest of the mandarin segments.
- 12. Grated chocolate can be added just before serving




