

Joan Loring, our Pledged Giving collector, has received the following letter from Oxfam:

“Dear Miss Loring

“Thank you very much for your Pledged Giving to Oxfam of £83.80....“This October we have run a month-long community fund-raising activity where we encouraged supporter to fundraise towards our climate change campaign. The theme of this fundraising drive is change. We asked supporters to do one of three things - change what they wear, change what they do, or collect loose change.

“Across the country individuals, schools, workplaces and groups got involved with all sorts of activities ranging from denim days and cake sales to wig wearing and giant collection buckets.

“All the money raised this October will support our work with people being affected by climate change. This could be from raising family homes above floodwater levels. Or it could be to provide flood-resistant seed to farmers.

“As examples of how people’s fundraising is making a difference, £10 can buy 10 x 20 litre seed storage containers, £78 can pay to lift a home above flood level, and £1,650 can equip a communal centre to receive and help evacuated people.

COOKERY CORNER

The following recipe has been sent by Ann Vickery (née Weir) who was a Youth Club member from 1955 to 1962, when she married Mike. They now live in Brixham. Ann says that this recipe is one of their family favourites!

APPLE DAPPY

(A Devon recipe from Topsham by Heather Knee)

Ingredients

Butter to grease dish

300g (10oz) self raising flour

120g (5oz) margarine

60ml (4 tablespoons) milk (approx)

400 g (14oz) peeled, cored and diced cooking apples

100g (4oz) Demerara sugar

1 teaspoon mixed spice

2 tablespoons golden syrup

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 160°C, 325° F, gas mark 3.
2. Butter an ovenproof dish (roughly 25cm x 20cm)
3. Crumb the flour and fat, add the milk and knead lightly to form a smooth dough.
4. Roll out to form a rectangle
5. Sprinkle apple over the top, add the sugar and spice.



Retiring Collections following Holy Communion

For one month each quarter these collections are for a named charity. The amount received can fluctuate significantly, and in part is determined by who is in the congregation on the particular Sundays. Since the beginning of 2009, however, it has been our policy to make up the gift we send to a minimum of £30. Of course, if more than this sum is raised, the higher amount is sent.

During the last Connexional year (2008/9), the following amounts were received:-

Nov. (Local) St. Christopher's Hospice	£26.15
Feb. (National) Parkinson's Disease Society	£24.65 (£30 sent)
Jun. (International) Bible Lands Society	£32.53
Aug. (Methodist) Galloway's Society for the Blind	£46.41

In the current Connexional Year (2009/10), we will be supporting the following good causes:-

Local - **5000 Project** (based at Bromley URC), which provides fortnightly meals, food parcels, small welfare grants, advice and guidance and a cold weather shelter to people in housing need in the borough of Bromley.

National - **The Camphill Family**, which, through eleven communities, extends a reassuring hand to 500 of the most vulnerable people in Britain.

International - **The Starfish Asia Fund**, which supports Christian communities in Pakistan

CASA RICCI SOCIAL SERVICES

Below are extracts from a recent letter from Father Ruiz, whose work we support via "Joan's Tin".

"The 21st of September is my birthday, only 97 years young and our Lord is keeping me very well. So I can do everything I need and move with a wheelchair. In a few days I will go to China to see and console my lepers and my children.

"I just received a letter from the Director of the lepers in China, asking for 3-4 Sisters each for the 7 Leper Hospitals. The problem is where to find 25 Sisters to serve in 7 leprosariums. So I have to knock many doors, slowly, God will provide.

"The other day I received a letter from Dr. Shen, inspector of leprosariums. This is the doctor who discovered the unknown leprosarium of Lufeng. After a long time in Lufeng, I never heard of that. He sent to me the information on the horrible conditions of the place, no roads, no water, no electricity, collapsed houses... Thank God, now everything is new.

"The inspector sent me the information on another leprosarium, also in very bad condition, as there is not a road to reach the place. To repair the road will cost 426,000 RMB (58,504), but the government does not have the money to repair and myself cannot help so much.

"The work of the mobile clinic is going on, giving back the vision to the cataract victims. Somebody is asking me if we can do the same for the eyes and the ears.

"Fr. Azpiroz is back already. His work is specialized in Aids victims. They look after the children with Aids and look for the Sisters who want to take care of them. Many mothers who are very sick and weak, and they help them with milk.
