

#### FROM THE MINISTER

# THE LORD IS RISEN! He is Risen indeed, Alleluia!

How wonderful it must have been for Mary to see Jesus and know that he had come alive! On Easter Sunday morning, after Mary of Magdala sees that the stone has been removed from the entrance of the tomb, she runs to tell Peter and the Beloved Disciple. They run to see that the tomb is empty. Jesus is alive! One can only imagine their excitement.

Easter is the most important festival in the Christian calendar but I wonder how many of you will wake up on Easter day to find that they had got an Easter Egg, or how many you will give away? Indeed, some churches are preparing to give away Easter Eggs. But ever wondered why we give eggs at Easter, why do people decorate hard-boiled eggs, and go egg rolling? Why an egg at all? And what's so important about eggs at Easter?

Questions, questions, questions! An egg looks as though it is dead, it looks like a stone, but something alive comes out of it. An egg represents the tomb of Jesus, out of which he appeared alive at Easter after dying on Good Friday.

Easter began in the dark and in the tomb. The Easter we celebrate is an invitation out of darkness into the light of the risen Christ. It is that light which enables us to tell that darkness has ended and day, in the form of light and newness, is on its way back to us.

Easter Sunday marks an important season in which the church will celebrate for more than just one day, but through to Ascension Day, 10<sup>th</sup> May; forty days after the resurrection and when

Christ's spirit ascends to heaven.

Jesus alive ... that's the amazing news about Easter. It is therefore important that we make a great fuss and deck our churches with all the bright and cheerful Easter flowers, because it takes place in Spring, when all the world of nature is coming to life again...., well when the weather goes according to plan and no SNOW!

Friends, Easter is about our being made 'New again'. The second letter to the Christians at Corinth reads: "When anyone is joined to Christ they become a new being: the old person has gone, and a new person has come". And so in this wonderful promise of Easter, of light and new life, I send you our warmest wishes and the blessings of the risen Christ! Above all, enjoy your EASTER EGG!

#### **GENERAL CHURCH MEETING**

The Annual General Church Meeting is to be held on Sunday 22nd April as part of the morning service. The Constitutional Practice and Discipline of the Methodist Church (CPD) says that "The meeting shall be held for fellowship, for mutual counsel respecting the condition of the Local Church, including its financial affairs, for the election of church stewards and representatives and for any other purpose which the Conference may direct."

During the Meeting we have reports about the various parts of our church life e.g. Finance, Property, Junior Church, fellowship groups etc and we elect representatives of the church community to serve on the Church Council for the next year. The Church Stewards are also appointed at this meeting.

Further details of the meeting, together with nomination forms for representatives to serve on the Church Council, and for Stewards, will be distributed shortly. If you would like to know more about what is involved in being a member of the Church Council, or serving as a steward, please speak to me or Abe.

#### CHANGES TO THE SUNDAY MORNING SERVICE

Following the Church Visioning Review held at the end of last year, the Church Stewards have been considering the responses received from the congregation about some of the matters raised in the Review.

<u>Fellowship</u> There was concern that there were limited opportunities for fellowship after morning service, and for the chance to speak to new people coming to the church. Although it was acknowledged that some members engaged them in conversation, it was felt that this would be more effective over a cup of tea after the service. Also, many members of the congregation only see each other on a Sunday, so a chance to chat over a cup of tea would be welcome.

<u>Time of morning service</u>. In view of the above, it was recommended by the stewards that the time of the morning service be changed to 10.30am. The Church Council discussed this matter at their last meeting and voted to recommend to the General Church Meeting that the time of the morning service should be changed to 10.30am to give more time to enable further fellowship after the service. This decision will be discussed at the General Church Meeting on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> April, following which a final decision will be made.

Please think carefully about whether you are in favour of the time of the morning service being changed to 10.30am. Would this affect other things you or your family do on a Sunday? If you have children, would an earlier start time mean a rush to get everyone ready in time? Are there other reasons that would make an earlier start inconvenient for you? Conversely, an earlier start time may be beneficial for you if you have other things you have to do on Sunday afternoons. Some churches in the Circuit already have their morning service at 10.30am, so preachers are used to an earlier starting time.

If you have any questions about the proposals, have a word with one of the Stewards, and if you are unable to be at the General Church Meeting, please let me or one of the Stewards know your opinion on the proposed change.

At the heart of healing ministry at MCHW is our conviction that God wants to channel healing grace to all who seek healing and wholeness in their lives. Prayer is offered for healing in body, mind and spirit, in the name of Jesus Christ and through the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Healing Prayer Team at MCHW is available to offer ministry as follows.

#### **Healing Services**

The first Sunday evening of each month at 6-30pm in the Great Hall.

The third Thursday of each month at 12-30pm in the Chapel.

#### **Healing Space**

A drop-in facility for those wanting a listening ear and prayer. Second Saturday of the month in the Chapel/Broadbent Room from 11-00am to 1-00pm.

<u>Healing Prayer</u> is offered after each Sunday morning service in the Great Hall.

<u>Healing Ministry Explored</u> is an online course enabling groups and churches to consider setting up some form of healing ministry.

<u>Parkinson's Advice Centre</u> is the first such centre in Westminster. Meetings are for people with Parkinson's, their carers and those interested in learning about the illness. Meetings are held on the first Friday of each month from 2pm-4pm.



# COOKERY CORNER Jam Buns

#### Ingredients

100gr. (4oz) self-raising flour pinch of salt

50gr.(2oz) margarine 1 egg 50gr. (2oz) sugar jam

#### Method

1. Prepare a flat greased baking tin

- 2. Prepare the oven for moderately hot 350°-400° F, (180°-200°C, gas mark 4-6).
- 3. Sieve the flour and salt
- 4. Add the sugar and mix well
- 5. Add margarine and rub gently until like breadcrumbs
- 6. Break the egg and sprinkle over the flour mixture.
- 7. Beat thoroughly with a fork until it is one piece.
- 8. Place on a floured board and roll into a sausage shape.
- 9. Divide into six pieces, evenly
- 10. Shape, and make a hole in the centre for jam
- 11. Place the buns on the greased baking tin and fill holes with jam
- 12. Bake at once in prepared oven for 15-20 minutes.
- NB. This recipe was from 1954 in a school recipe book I had made, and I had to write out spelling mistakes three times!
