

FROM THE MINISTER

Dear Friends,

Have you prepared then. Are you ready? Ready for the Easter period; ready in the garden; ready in your home; ready in your spiritual life?

In the garden, has all the deadwood been taken out? Trees flourish after pruning. The deadwood inhibits the growth. It clutters the tree or bush, it reduces the light and restricts the new growth and hence any fruit. It helps to keep the tree healthy, revitalised. Are you ready? Is all prepared? How is it all looking?

In your home, has the spring cleaning been done? If so has it been done properly? Has every nook and crevice been checked and cleaned? Are the windows clean? Is the light that is now coming in illuminating a comfortable environment, one fresh and ready for all that will take place in it. Is it fit for your visitors? Will you be happy for them to see it?

In your spiritual life, how are you feeling? Is it clogged up with deadwood? Have you done the cleaning this Lent? When the light is shining on you will you be comfortable with what you and others see? Is your life revitalised, fresh, ready for new experiences, responsibilities, moving forward?

The great news is to get rid of the deadwood, to revitalise your life, to bear more fruit you don't need to do it because Christ has already done it for you. He gave his life so that all that clutters up your life is taken on him. All you need to do is acknowledge he is there for you and ask for the cleaning to be done. The cross is your cleansing agent.

And after the cross comes the resurrection. That which was dead, cluttered, unclean, is now renewed, uncluttered, cleansed. You can see the light and as the light lights up your life that which is seen will be ready for others to see and follow.



That is what Christ offers. A new, revitalised, fresh life, ready to bear more fruit for Jesus. The choice is yours, have a great Easter and give life to those around you. Let your new life make them ask the question what is the difference?

Benevolent Fund Collection

This is the retiring collection taken as you leave the chapel following services that include Holy Communion. These usually take place on the 2nd Sunday evening and the 3rd Sunday morning each month. The collections received during February, June (not May*), August and November are for specific good causes, which are announced in the printed Notice Sheet on Sunday. Our practice has been to support a local, a national, an international and a 'Methodist' charity each year.

The remaining collections go into our Benevolent Fund from which we are able to make modest disbursements to meet local personal needs.

Envelopes for the Benevolent Fund collections are available on the table at the back of the chapel. Individuals in the Envelope Scheme only need to add their number. However, instead of searching for an envelope at the end of the service and then hunting around for a biro (!) I can let you have your own supply to keep at home. If you would like a set please let me know.
