#### FROM THE MINISTER

Friends,

These are extraordinary times. The government and the Church continue to introduce measures, the like of which haven't been seen in peace time UK. Indeed, CoVid-19 (the illness produced by the coronavirus) is said to be the worst respiratory illness since the flu epidemic over one hundred years ago. Our daily lives have changed dramatically, and we are now having to follow extraordinary guidelines which continue to change daily

Scripture speaks of the tribe of Issachar as having leaders who "understood the signs of the times and knew the best course for Israel to take" (1 Chron. 12:32, NIV). In his latest update, the Secretary of the Methodist Conference, the Revd Dr Jonathan Hustler, is urging us to 'change the way we go to church', as the church and all businesses on its premises will remain closed until further notice. And so, it is, that we must adapt to the times and use all available means of witnessing to the gospel

Worshipping At Home: Even though we are not meeting for public worship, this does not mean that we cease to be church. We will continue to be a praying, worshiping community even though we are not meeting in a church building. "All the Christians in a particular city, whether they assembled together in one place or in several places for religious worship, were an ecclesia (church). Thus all the disciples in Antioch, forming several congregations, were one church (Acts 13:1). The whole body of professing Christians throughout the world (1 Corinthians 15:9; Galatians 1:13; Matthew 16:18) are the church of Christ. We may be scattered for now, but remain one in the body of Christ.

It dawns on us that our taking does not match your giving.


In this Lenten season revise our taking,

# COOKERY CORNER Devonshire Flan

Serves 4 to 6

#### Ingredients

175 gr. (6 oz) shortcrust pastry, made using 175 gr.(6 oz) flour, 50gr. (2 oz) margarine, 50 gr. (2 oz) Trex or lard and about 75gr. (3 tablespoons) cold water.

25gr.(1 oz) Butter
25gr. (1 oz) plain flour
3 hard-boiled eggs
150 ml. (½ pint) milk
50 gr. (2 oz) shelled prawns
1 teaspn chopped parsley
parsley to garnish

# Method

- 1. Heat the oven to 400°F/ gas mark 6/ 200°C/ fan 180°.
- 2. Mix dry ingredients for pastry to fine breadcrumbs consistency, add water, roll out to thickness of ¼ inch, and line a 20 or 23 cm (8 or 9 inch) flan ring and bake blind for 20 minutes.
- 3. Make the parsley sauce, melt butter in a pan, add the flour and stir well over a low heat.
- 4. Add the milk, a little at a time, mixing all the time.
- 5. Return to a low heat and bring slowly to the boil, and cook for a minute or two.
- 6. Add cheese, chopped eggs, prawns, add I teaspoon chopped parsley and bring back to nearly boiling point.
- 7. Pour into the hot pastry case, garnish with parsley, and serve at once with new potatoes and fresh vegetables.


And God created CAT to be a companion to Adam and Eve.
