LETTER FROM THE MINISTER

Greetings from the Manse in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

A Story

"Once upon a time, there was a little girl who had a terrible day. She left her lunch at home. She skinned her knee on the playground, and no one wanted to sit with her on the bus. As she sank into her mother's arms at the end of the day, her mother said.

"Honey, what was the best part of today?" The little girl cried and said, "Nothing! The entire day was terrible. "So the mother got down on one knee, wiped away her tears and said, "There is always some good. Sometimes we just really have to look for it." The little girl looked up at her mom and said, "What is good about today?" And the mother said, "For starters, you're here in my arms."

Without doubt, we are living in a period of transition and we long to know what awaits us at the end of the journey. It might well be that the Church in Britain will never be the same again but we don't know what 'not the same' means. Having attended a couple of services over the last few weeks - masked, with no hand-shaking but multiple opportunities to sanitize, and conscious of the many who could not be there or who reluctantly chose not to be there - I've been left with a

sense of the impermanence of the current arrangements, writes the Secretary of Conference for the Methodist Church, the Revd. Dr. Jonathan Hustler. We do not want to live or to worship like this for long. Yet perhaps the peculiar nature of the current arrangements makes us more conscious of the guiding light – we in our inhibited way affirm that we are still God's people and that God has not finished with us yet and anytime.

So, whether we gather together to worship God in our buildings or online, we are held in God's arms. May we continue to recognize that gift, and in doing so, may we sow joy, love, patience, justice and peace.

and she is in each challenge.


Perhaps it will have been the biggest mystery in the end,

that God was not a secret, but that he was always as close to us as our own heart.



Online book of remembrance opened at St Paul's

St Paul's Cathedral has launched Remember Me, an online book of remembrance for all those who have been living in the UK who have died as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. People of all faiths, beliefs or none are invited to contribute to Remember Me.

HRH The Prince of Wales, who recorded a video message, said: "This virtual book of remembrance is here not just to recall our loss and sorrow, but also to be thankful for everything good that those we have loved brought into our lives."

Family, friends and carers of those who have died can submit, free of charge, the name, photograph and a short message in honour of a deceased person via the Remember Me website. The deceased person must have been living in the UK. Remember Me will be open for entries for as long as needed. It is intended that the Remember Me site will become a physical memorial at the Cathedral.



John Wesley and his routine of daily prayer.

In 1779, John Wesley had a house built as his London residence in the courtyard of his Chapel in City Road, London. His bedroom was on the first floor, and leading off his bedroom is a small prayer room, containing a small table which held his Bible and a candlestick, and a kneeler in front of it.

John prayed here both morning and evening. In the morning he would get up at 4 a.m. and spend an hour in praying and reading the Bible, before crossing the courtyard to the Chapel for the Chapel service at 5.30 a.m. The service was held this early because most of the congregation were working people who would go to their day jobs after leaving the service.

This little prayer room is often called "the Power House of Methodism" because this is where John Wesley received the strength from God to carry out his work for the Church.

Even today the Prayer Room has a special feel to it, and it is not unusual for visitors to ask if they can kneel at John Wesley's table to say a prayer.

Here is a prayer written by John Wesley.

"Looking to Jesus, let us run the race that is set before us. Rooted in the faith of the saints, let us keep an even pace. Grounded in catholic love, let us rejoice in God's grace. AMEN"

COOKERY CORNER

Baked Alaska

Cooking time 3 mins. Oven temp. 450°F/Mark 8/ 200°C fan

<u>Ingredients</u>

18cm (7 inch) Sponge flan (can be bought)
Soft fruit (mandarins, oranges, raspberries etc.)
3-4 egg whites
Large block of ice-cream
100grams (4 tablespoons) caster sugar
Cherries, angelica to decorate

Method

- 1. Put fruit into flan, stand sponge on a heatproof plate or dish.
- 2. Whisk the egg whites until stiff, gradually beat in the sugar.
- 3. Place the block of ice-cream on the sponge flan and completely enclose with the meringue. No part of the ice-cream should be visible, or the ice-cream will melt.
- 4. Place in the hot oven for 3 minutes in order to crisp and brown the meringue.
- 5. Decorate with cherries and angelica and serve immediately.
