#### FROM THE MINISTER

Grace and peace from our Lord Jesus Christ!

Friends, a very Happy New year, and I hope this finds you well.

It felt a little strange to be writing for Easter, with barely Christmas over on 6<sup>th</sup> January, Epiphany. But I was quickly reminded about the gifts of the 'three wise men' to honour the infant Jesus; gifts chosen for their special spiritual symbolism: gold representing his kingship, frankincense, his priestly role, and myrrh, an early indication of Christ's death and embalming, which points or leads us to the significant events of the Passion of Christ.

It is therefore worth noting that our Christian festivals are not simply tick box exercises, but rather they link us with our heritage and forthcoming festivals.

And so, in the lead up to Lent, I write of another such significant event, Transfiguration Sunday, on 27 February 2022, the Sunday before Lent. Its position in the Christian year suggests why the Transfiguration was given; to offer encouragement before a time of rigour. Peter, John, and James were given a vision of Christ in glory, the risen and ascended Lord, as they struggled to come to terms with what Jesus had said about the trouble and suffering that lay ahead.

Traditionally, Lent encourages Christian to give up and make sacrifices, to tighten our belts and deny ourselves excess, to better understand the way of the cross, the suffering of Jesus and the world. On the day before, Shrove Tuesday, Mardi Gras (Fat Tuesday) or Pancake Day, people said good-bye to meat (*carne vale*). The last of the rich foods are eaten before the fasting began with the start of

Lent on Ash Wednesday. 'Shrove' refers to making confession and Lent is associated with a time of review and reflection. Lent offers us the opportunity to embrace change, to re-examine priorities and to remember the needs of our neighbour.

Transfiguration Sunday not only makes us more aware of the needs of our neighbours but gives to us, as to Peter, John and James, a vision of Christ in Glory, for our encouragement and hope day by day as we journey with Jesus towards the cross.

On this Sunday before the start of Lent, may we look at the event known as the Transfiguration of Christ, and ask what this unusual or maybe even strange happening can say to us and our world.

May the encouragement that Jesus gave to His disciples at the Transfiguration, also encourage us in the coming days.

To help us on our journey this Lent, there will be a four-part 'Lenten Study', details as follows:

#### Mothering Sunday - 27<sup>th</sup> March

There is an old Jewish saying: God could not be everywhere, and therefore He made mothers. Mother Church, Mother Earth, Mother of the Gods, our human mothers, and mother-figures – all of them have been part of the celebration of 'Mothering Sunday' – as the fourth Sunday in Lent is affectionately known. It has been celebrated in the UK since at least the 16th century.

In Roman times, great festivals were held every Spring to honour Cybele, Mother of all the Gods. Other pagan festivals in honour of Mother Earth were also celebrated. With the arrival of Christianity, the festival became one honouring Mother Church. During the Middle Ages, young people apprenticed to craftsmen or working as 'live-in' servants were allowed only one holiday a year on which to visit their families – which is how 'Mothering Sunday' got its name. This special day became a day of family rejoicing, and the Lenten fast was broken. In some places the day was called Simnel Day, because of the sweet cakes called simnel cakes traditionally eaten on that day.

In recent years the holiday has changed and, in many ways, now resembles the American Mother's Day (on second Sunday in May), with families going out to Sunday lunch and generally making a fuss of their mother on the day. But this is not how the day began.

#### Some memorable moments with cats by Andrew T.

I've always talked to cats, and when Jemima, a long-haired black feline first appeared in the garden I spoke with her straight away. She was always friendly and invariably made a bee-line to me to be stroked. In a short while I discovered that I could pick her up by the scruff of her neck and carry her a short distance. She loved this and when I put her down would plead to be carried again.

She was a large cat with a certain presence. Jemima rarely hurried herself. The first I knew was when she appeared beside me, purring, having climbed a dozen or so metals rungs to where I was working!

Having received her 'approval' for my paintwork I was concerned that she could get herself down safely, after all cats and metal ladders don't seem a good combination. I needn't have worried. She deftly turned herself around, 'ran' down the rungs and continued on her way.

#### **Circuit Stationing: September 2022**

As many of you will know, our Minister Abe is leaving us at the end of July to move on to another Circuit. The Circuit invitations team have issued the following statement regarding her successor.

"The circuit invitations team is delighted to announce that our circuit has, in the first round of Presbyteral stationing, been successfully matched with Revd William Davis. William will be joining our circuit in September 2022 and will have pastoral charge of Upper Norwood and Anerley Methodist Churches. William will be coming to us from the Wolverhampton circuit. Previously, he served part time in the New River Circuit (North London) and part time as Chaplain to the Ghanaian Methodist Fellowship. Prior to that, he served in a number of appointments in Ghana, his home country, including work in Christian education. He comes to us with his wife Vashti, who is an early years teacher. William and Vashti have four children, though it seems likely that only two will make the move back to London. William brings experience, enthusiasm and an eagerness to build churches and faith in our circuit "

#### LETTER FROM RICCI SOCIAL SERVICES, MACAU

Several people in our church have been supporting Ricci Social Services for many years, via donations to Andrew Tredinnick via "The Tin". This is an extract from their latest letter.

#### The Joy of Walking Together

On long journeys, keeping walking together is not always Circumstances may tempt us to leave those who are weaker or different behind, specially when we feel they become a burden for our plans or personal projects. A contrary temptation inclines undue caution, walking pointlessly slowly and choosing safer or easier paths to walk while leaving our companions alone and in danger. More happily, walking with others, being together with them, can be a journey of transformation. Starting from St. Ignatius, Jesuits have known that to walk with the poor, those who suffer, those at the margins of societies unties them with Heaven and makes them friends of God and Companions of Jesus. Through walking together with those in suffering, Jesuits know who they themselves are and what they are called to be. The poor, the afflicted, the outcasts, are more than companions on a journey; they are the compass that shows the path to take.

This year we have commemorated the tenth anniversary of Fr. Ruiz's passing (27/7/2011). Fr. Ruiz started Casa Ricci as a living expression of this Jesuit identity and their deep desire to "walk with the poor" in China. The Chinese character "xing" represents a cross-roads and signifies "walking". Serving China's poor and marginalised means we walk with them. To keep walking beside them we take them as our guides, who enable us to grasp what needs to be done to build a more harmonious society. By walking with them, we also find the meaning of our own poverties. In China's ever-

changing society their needs change. As we walk with the poor, the afflicted and the outcast, we need to change as they change, continually developing new abilities to serve them better. Sufferers from leprosy and from HIV/AIDS, sex workers, hospital patients, small social service organisations needing help and support, all are guides for our journey.

To have good guides for al long journey brings confidence and shortens the way. The closer we walk with those who are suffering or have lost hope, the deeper is our joy in walking together with them. Fr. Ruiz used to say that the biggest joy is to help people feel joyful. The joy in walking together is mutual. This has been casa Ricci's experience since our beginning.

#### **COOKERY CORNER**

#### **Sugarless Low Fat Pineapple cake**

You will need a 20cm (8 inch) cake tin, well greased.

Ingredients to serve 6 to 8 portions

425 gr. (15oz) can of pineapple in natural juice

450 gr. (1 lb) mixed dried fruit

5 ml (1 oz) mixed spice

50 gr. (2 oz) corn oil

2 medium eggs, at room temperature

225 gr. (8 oz) white self-raising flour

#### Method

- 1. Crush the canned pineapple in its natural juice.
- 2. Place the pineapple, mixed fruit, mixed spice and corn oil in a saucepan.
- 3. Bring slowly to the boil for three minutes only and then leave until absolutely cold (preferably overnight).
- 4. Beat the eggs, then blend eggs and flour into the fruity mixture in the saucepan.
- 5. Bake at Gas mark 3 (325°F/170°C (150°C for fan oven)) for about 1½ hours, covering if necessary.
- 6. Test if done with a skewer, or the point of a long knife.
- 7. When cold, store in the refrigerator.


