

I hope you are keeping well. It is so good to give you updates on Living Hope School. The children have settled back in after their summer holiday. During the summer holiday, we redecorated the school and carried out necessary maintenance work.

As many of you have seen in the news, this year monsoon rain affected badly and one-third of the country was under water. Water is receding but it has affected millions of people. Most of the transport links and crops have been destroyed by the floods. Even though the flood waters have not affected the school directly, the devastation caused by the floods and the increase in inflation at record levels has affected all of our students and teachers. The school electricity cost has tripled in the last few and there is a severe shortage of food. Many of our student's families cannot even afford to buy an onion or a tomato.

We pray and hope that the roads and bridges are repaired soon so the goods can be transported to different regions. With your financial support, we are still able to carry on the good work of equipping our students with a life-changing education. Please continue to pray for our teachers, students and their families.

Andrew's Railway Journeys

3. Beginning, middle & end, or rather middle, end & front!

I was fortunate as a child to have regular summer holidays. Invariably we went west, to holiday resorts in Dorset, Devon and Cornwall, or occasionally to the Welsh coast. Our journeys sometimes started at Waterloo, but in the main we left from Paddington. As a young boy it was particularly exciting for me to be able to 'spot' some different trains, because in south London there was a dearth of steam locomotives to be seen.

Sometime in the mid 1950's our holiday was in St. Ives which is situated in the far west of Cornwall. We joined the train at Paddington on a busy summer Saturday. Our service was headed for Penzance, but whether it was the *Cornish Riviera Express* or a relief train I cannot remember. What I do recall is that our coach was situated somewhere near the middle of a train consisting of more than a dozen carriages.

Somewhere in Devon, possibly at Newton Abbot or maybe Plymouth several coaches were detached and, instead of being in the middle of the train, we crossed the Royal Albert Bridge and entered Cornwall in what had become the very last carriage.

Progress thereafter is the slowest part of the journey as calls are made at several rural stations. Nowadays on reaching St. Erth it is necessary to change to a local service to reach St. Ives. Back then, however, the last two or three carriages were detached leaving the leading coaches to continue through to Penzance. At the same time, a small tank engine was attached at the rear, and drew the remaining carriages back out of the station to head along the branch line to St. Ives. Suddenly we were now at the front right behind the locomotive!

Blackheath and Crystal Palace Circuit Advent Bible Study 2022

Following on from the well supported Circuit Advent Bible studies of the past two years, using the Zoom platform, the circuit staff team has decided to jointly deliver another study this year. We are using material that has come to us from a Celtic Christian site called 'Faith and worship'. Resources from this site are widely used in many different Christian traditions.

This year's study was written by the Preacher, poet and writer, John Birch. His study is based on the famous hymn 'Hark the Glad Sound', number 171 in Singing the Faith. The hymn was written by Philip Doddridge, the 18th century hymn writer who was a contemporary of the Wesley brothers and Isaac Watts.

'Hark the glad sound' is a four-week study. Each week's study is based on a verse of the hymn. It includes Old Testament, Gospel and Epistle readings for each week. Also questions for discussion and ideas for prayer and devotion.

We will be meeting every Wednesday evening at 7.30pm by zoom. Below are the details of the study as we have organised it. It will be an interactive study in which we encourage all who are able participate to be involved in the discussions. We do hope that as many people as possible from across the circuit are able to join us and enjoy both the study and the cross-circuit fellowship of friends.

COOKERY CORNER

West Country Pudding

Serves 5 - 6. Cooking time 1 hour. Oven temperature 375°F/ 190°C/ Gas mark 5

Ingredients

<u>Pastry</u>

175gr (6 oz) self-raising flour 75gr (3oz) suet Water to mix

Topping

40gr.(1½ oz.) margarine

75gr (3oz) soft brown sugar

Filling

675gr (1½ lb) cooking apples, peeled, cored and sliced. 50gr (2 oz) sugar

Method

- 1. Mix together dry pastry ingredients with sufficient water to make a pliable dough.
- 2. Cream together topping ingredients and spread on the bottom of a well-greased 900ml (1½ pint) pie dish.
- 3. Roll out $\frac{2}{3}$ of the pastry and use to line the dish.
- 4. Fill the dish with sliced apples, sprinkle with sugar, finishing with a layer of apples.
- 5. Roll out the remaining pastry to cover the apples and seal the edges firmly.

- 6. Bake in the centre of the pre-heated oven, on a baking tray, for about an hour or until golden.
- 7. Turn out the pudding on a large dish, the sauce will run out and cover the dish.
- 8. Serve hot with custard or cream.


HELP WANTED
