

REFLECTION FROM THE MINISTER

Friends, in Jesus' parable of the sower, the seed landed on four types of ground, producing four different results. The seed that fell on the footpath represents those who hear the message, only to have Satan come at once and take it away. The seed on the rocky soil represents those who hear the message and immediately receive it with joy. But since they don't have deep roots, they don't last long. They fall away as soon as they have problems or are persecuted for believing God's word. The seed that fell among the thorns represents others who hear God's word, but all too quickly the message is crowded out buy the worries of this life, the lure of wealth, and the desire for other things, so no fruit is produced. And the seed that fell on good soil represents those who hear and accept God's word and produce a harvest of thirty, sixty, or even a hundred times as much as had been planted.

Friends, the seed of God's word cannot fail. 'It always produces fruit' (Isaiah 55:11). So, if God's promises aren't being fulfilled in your life, ask yourself, 'What kind of soil am I'? Friends, are you a surface person – thin – skinned and easily offended? A shallow person with no spiritual root system?. Are you thorny ground? Are 'the worries of this life, the lure of wealth, and the desire for other things' choking the spiritual life out of you? Or are you rich, fertile ground that produces results? Friends, CHECK THE SOIL OF YOUR HEART.

The Penge Community Pre-School is approaching its 55th year at the Church. It begun as the Anerley Playgroup in 1968 before developing into the Playgroup in 1975. It further evolved developing its work from 'play' to 'Learning' to become a Pre-School in 1983. The Pre-School is the longest continuous non church group using our premises – even surviving the fire in 1979

They have just had their OFSTED inspection and once again passed with flying colours being grades as 'Good' in all categories.



In fact they have a well respected reputation for providing special care and learning experiences to 'special children'. Pre-School also has a number of children for whom English is not their first language and some that have come from war torn areas around the world who bring with them the trauma of seeing things that children should not have to experience.

At the end of term in July, when the older children move on to Junior School the staff were delighted and humbled to receive a number of thank you cards – including the one below. Which seems to say it all.

COOKERY CORNER

Jam Crumblies

<u>Ingredients</u>

100gr (4oz) margarine 50gr (2oz) sugar

225gr (8oz) plain flour 225gr (8oz) strawberry jam

7 inch square shallow tin.

Method

1. Set the oven to fairly hot, Gas mark 6, 400°F or 200°C.

- 2. Cut the margarine into the flour, rub it in until it resembles breadcrumbs.
- 3. Divide the mixture in half and add enough water to one half to make a soft dough.
- 4. Knead lightly on a floured surface, roll out the dough to line the sides and base of the tin. Mark the sides of the pastry to make a decorative edge.
- 5. Spread the strawberry jam evenly over the pastry base
- 6. Add the sugar to the remaining crumble mixture, and spread over the jam.
- 7. Bake above the centre of the oven for about 40-45 minutes until golden in colour.
- When cold, cut into fingers.
 NB This recipe can also be used with mincemeat.
