Don't let that priority 'slip'. There is a sobering illustration of this in the Old Testament. A soldier was given custody of an important prisoner. He was told, 'If by any means he is missing, your life shall be for his life, or else you shall pay a talent of silver'(1 Kings 20:39). In spite of the warning, he allowed his prisoner to escape. How did it happen? Through carelessness and busyness. 'While your servant was busy here and there, he was gone'. Then the King of Israel said to him, 'So shall your judgment be; you yourself have decided it'.

Friends, keeping your spiritual priorities in place is your responsibility and no one else's. If you don't do it, you will pay a high price. 'But I pray each morning', you say. That's good, but do you take time to listen to God and get direction before you rush into your day?. Some of us have deleted from our Bibles and our thoughts those Scriptures that command us to 'wait on God'. There is a work going on in your life right now. You may not be fully aware of it, but without it you will never be qualified to handle what God has in mind for you. The Bible says, 'Jesus often withdrew and prayed' (Luke 5:16). Spending time with God is the price you pay for hearing from Him and doing His will. Spiritually speaking, there is no shortcut to any place that's worth going. **AMEN**

EASTER OFFERING SERVICE

The Circuit Easter Offering Service took place at Forest Hill Methodist Church on the afternoon of Sunday 5th May. The Service is prepared by Methodist Women in Britain on behalf of the World Mission Fund, and this year was entitled " Let Justice Roll". The service was thought –provoking, and was well-attended by members of Churches from across the Circuit.

This was a special occasion as the speaker was the Rev Nigel Cowgill, our Chair of District. Nigel is leaving the London District in July to take up a post in the Methodist Connexion, so this was the last time most of us will hear him preach in his capacity of Chair of District.

12. Train driver of the year!

Valerie and I visited my cousin in Bedford on a Capital Connect service which we had joined at London Bridge. We caught the train back at about 6pm intending to return home the same way. As we approached north London the driver announced that because of a line-side fire near London Bridge the train, which was going to Brighton, was be diverted through Herne Hill and Crystal Palace and re-join its scheduled route at East Croydon. We were not particularly concerned as we could pick up a bus or tram from there to get us home.

While waiting at Blackfriars station announcements could be heard saying the train was travelling via London Bridge! The driver, however, cut in saying the train was definitely being diverted and to ignore what the platform staff were saying. After a short delay we got underway again. The train now was quite full with a good number of passengers standing.

However, our progress came to an abrupt halt just short of Herne Hill station when the brakes slammed on for an emergency stop, causing several people to nearly fall over. "Apologies for that, said the driver, "but some idiot has just run across the track in front of me – I don't think I hit him! I've now got to alert Control so we may be held here for some time. I'll let you know what's going on". After a while he said, "The power supply is being cut off while a search is made for him – we will then be on reserve power only". A few minutes later most of the lights went off and we resigned ourselves to a long wait. We then heard, "If there's railway employee on the train can they come forward and make themselves known to me". There was another pause before he said, "I can see the search party coming along the track looking for the culprit". Through the window we could see several torch lights bobbing up and down as the track was searched.

The driver made another announcement. "I've got a colleague now positioned in the rear half of the train. If anyone is travelling to Gatwick Airport to catch a flight or has a medical condition that we should be made aware of come forward to me, if you are in the front portion of the train, otherwise speak with my colleague who is making his way through the rear portion". We continued to sit in the gloom and wondered how much longer before we moved.

"They've got him said the driver jubilantly – we shan't be long now", and we could see somebody being frogmarched beside the track back towards the lights of the station just a couple of hundred yards further on. A few minutes later full lighting came back on as the power was restored. The mood of the passengers brightened.

However, we remained stationary. "I'm sorry", said the driver, "but we can't go yet – the police are having to deal with a fight that has just broken out on the station platform which is nothing to do with the trespasser!" There was another significant delay before eventually we got underway. But the driver wasn't finished. "You're all entitled to claim compensation for the delay. Make sure you get the forms at your local station." He then announced the 'train number' for passengers to quote on the claim forms.


When we got off at East Croydon there was a gaggle of passengers crowding round the driver's cab-side window. People were shaking his hand, and calling out, *"Thank you"* and *"Well done"* etc. I've no doubt his response to the situation and willingness to tell us what was happening prevented people's tempers from boiling over. It's easy to criticise railway staff when things go wrong and perhaps too rarely do we express appreciation when they do their best in difficult circumstances. Afterwards I wrote to the railway company expressing my appreciation for the way the driver had handled the situation and asking them to convey my thanks to him. They assured me they would do so.








Living Hope maintains a school and community centre for children and their families at Baddomalhi in Pakistan.
